Recently, we discovered that, a person whom we had previously helped from our Love Fund offering, had gotten hold of the phone numbers of some of our leaders and was calling them at home for help. We have, as a result, scrubbed our website of any home phone numbers. We are so sorry this happened. But we want you to know that the church office would never give out your personal information for non-church use. Nor would we send anyone to you directly for help. And contrary to his story, we are not out of funds. We do, however, follow some guidelines for how we share this money.

We feel privileged to be able to help those who are in need. Help is given during our office hours. **We never give cash!** We also have an extensive list of other helping agencies and we try to connect folks with these other resources as well. We do limit our help to a single time each year. We record each gift in our database and make a copy of each recipient's ID. We also record their phone number from our caller ID.

We provide Smith's cards for gas, food, and groceries. We have a few items of food on hand that we give to provide immediate help. We buy bus Fairpay cards for students. We pay some utilities but only directly to the utility companies. We occasionally pay for a room at a motel. We will help with rent in a housing complex if they use a management company that can receive the funds electronically. Two people usually sign off on each gift. For larger gifts we call another church leader and ask for their approval as well. **Once more, we do not give cash.**

We do have some folks who would take advantage of our generosity and we try to be careful with our funds. On the other hand, we have found that our members and constituents are often reluctant to ask for help. Be assured that your privacy will be respected and that we understand that anyone can have difficult circumstances. Please ask if you need help. We have also found that our members have brought truly needy friends and neighbors to our attention. We appreciate your help.

We have been warned in scripture to "be wise as snakes and innocent as doves." (Matt 10:16) We try to follow this advice in the church office and ask that you seek to walk in this way as well. Please feel free to call if you have further questions.

## ~~YOUTH UPDATE~~

Hello Everyone,

As you know we are a couple of weeks into our youth year and things are going well. This year we will be focusing on building community bridges and stepping out of our comfort zones and learning more about our brothers and sisters from different cultural backgrounds and different religious backgrounds. The first week the youth attended the refugee talk held at Mountain Vista UMC in early September. There we learned about what being a refugee means, the criteria one must meet to be labeled a refugee and the vetting they must go through before they are accepted and put on a list to be moved. This process can take anywhere from 2 to 10 years! We also heard a personal story from a Sudanese refugee living here in Utah working for Workforce services helping other refugee families find work. We will be continuing conversations with Workforce services for ways that we can reach out to our refugee neighbors in meaningful ways. The second week we celebrated the return of youth group with a pool party at J.L. Sorenson recreation center and some pizza to cap off the day. Last week we ventured down to Library Square in the pouring rain for an interactive tour and presentation by Doctors Without Borders on refugees. There we experienced what refugee camps are like, what it's like to be a refugee, to flee from your own home, having no time at all to grab only what's important before you leave, to be separated from your family, to have to pay for your passage into another country, for transportation and finally what's it like to finally arrive in a refugee camp. It was an excellent presentation to give us more information and to have small experience similar to what 65.6 million people worldwide have to endure. Next week we will lighten it up with a scavenger hunt downtown, hopefully without rain this time!

I am working on ironing out the youth schedule for the fall as we've had some exciting changes that requires a rearranging of the calendar. I'm excited to announce we are working on a fall retreat in October. I have one adult volunteer, but am in need of a male chaperone as well. If you are interested please give me a call so we can further discuss what will be involved. Stay tuned for more information!

October 8th is our first fundraiser of the year. Come with your dirty cars and the youth will wash them for a donation of your choice during both services and fellowship time. Pull your car up in the line, leave the keys in the ignition and we'll take care of the rest. This fundraiser will go towards a youth nest egg to help eliminate the cost for kids and our families. We understand that kids are often involved in many activities and that families can find it hard to come up with the money to make all of these things happen. We are excited to offer different youth activities that are free or have minimal cost associated. However, we also attend several youth events that have higher costs, such as; Fall Retreats, Westside weekend in Colorado, Spring Fling Youth Lock In and Mission trips. The money we raise goes towards lowering that cost to the families as well as paying for our adult chaperones to attend. I am currently planning the first mission trip for our youth in 3 years. We will be heading to Seattle, Washington with L.A.S.T. (Learning And Serving Together). This is the same program we worked with 2 years ago when we went to Portland, Oregon and I am excited for a new opportunity of service with a new group of kids. Look for more information as we get closer to Spring.

I can't do this without your help! I am still in need of volunteer help, either during Sunday School at 10am for an hour or for activities after church. If you may be interested take time to pray about and please ask me questions, I'd be happy to sit down with you to further discuss what to expect. Finally I just wanted to say how much I appreciated everyone's efforts and support of our youth group over the last year. We have felt supported and lifted up by our congregation and I can't say thank you enough. These kids of ours are awesome and encourage you to get to know them. They have greatly enriched my life.

UMCOR gives \$10,000 grant for Yellowstone Conference fires

The Rev. David Burt, Yellowstone Conference Director of Connectional Ministry and Assistant to the Bishop, reports the Yellowstone Conference received a \$10,000 emergency grant from the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) for fire relief. One check for \$5,000 was sent to the United Way of Missoula County, Montana, for the Lolo Peak, Rice Ridge and Seeley Lake fires. Another check for \$5,000 was sent to the Garfield County Fire Foundation to assist in restocking fire-fighting supplies in eastern Montana. The Lodgepole Complex fire in eastern Montana has received a huge number of donations, including hay and fencing material.

## UMCOR in the Yellowstone Conference

From Aug. 10 to 12, Mountain Sky Area Disaster Response Coordinator Rev. Gary Haddock visited pastors and churches in western Montana to assess their situations and address immediate needs from the ongoing wildfires.

*We've applied for a \$10,000 Emergency Grant from UMCOR and received it in the Yellowstone Conference. There have been as many as 25+ fires going on all at the same time in Montana. A great many of these have been started by dry Thunderstorms. They have had close to 1,000,000 acres burned but very few homes since they are so spread out and because of the great work of the firefighters to save structures. That number doesn't include outbuildings.*

*The people of Montana are also dealing with high amounts of smoke that is settling and is often in the "Red" category of unsafe for even healthy people to be moving in. The money will go to help with incidental needs for people around the Missoula area as well as helping with ranches where miles and miles of fence has been either burned or melted by the intense heat.*

*We, as UMCOR, aren't the first ones in but we promise to keep working with them until they can get back on their feet. Any donations that can be made to the Yellowstone Annual Conference Disaster Fund will go to help these fires in whatever ways we can help. If that money is more than the needs, it will be saved to help with future disasters that may occur.*

*Please keep the people of Montana in your prayers and give as you can.*

Kits can be sent directly to Sager Brown, **Depot West** or delivered to an **affiliate warehouse nearest you**. Thank you all for your support.

The Rev. Gary Haddock, Mountain Sky Area Disaster Response Coordinator, also said churches can start collecting money and supplies for UMCOR so they can provide help as needed. He is already checking into Early Response Teams (ERT) to send as well as offering tool trailers. Haddock said United Methodist Volunteers in Mission (UMVIM) teams can start getting ready to help with recovery in a few months. And finally, prayers are always needed.
