## Pastor's Ponderings... "Responding to Grace"

GRACE—the unmerited, unconditional, unwarranted, undeserved, unearned love and forgiveness of God. There is nothing we can do to be worthy of receiving this gift. It was given before we were ever born, when Jesus died on the cross for our sins.

Still, God's Word does indicate several **responses** to this free gift of forgiveness—responses that come out of a sense of gratitude and joy for what God has already done for us:

### A. That we admit (acknowledge, confess) our sin:

- **Psalm 32:5.** <sup>5</sup>I acknowledge my sin to you, and my iniquity I have not hidden. I said, I will confess my transgressions to the LORD; and you forgave the iniquity of my sin.

### B. That we are truly sorry for our sin:

- **Psalm 38:18.** <sup>18</sup>For I will declare my iniquity; I will be sorry for my sin.

### C. That we go to the person with whom we have had the broken relationship.

- **Matthew 5:23-25.** <sup>23</sup>Therefore if you bring your gift to the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you; <sup>24</sup>Leave the gift there before the altar, and go your way; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. <sup>25</sup>Agree with your adversary quickly, while you are still on the way with him...

Who is that brother or sister who has something against you? When will you go to that person to seek reconciliation? What will you say to her/him? How will you depend on God through the whole process?

God is with you as you respond in gratitude to God's miraculous gift of grace.

## **The Lord's Supper—The Deeper Meaning Communion Part One: Grace and Means of Grace**

*"This Holy Mystery: A United Methodist Understanding of Holy Communion" was approved by 2004 General Conference. This documentation is the official statement, practice, theology of the Lord's Supper for United Methodists.*

*Gayle Felton describes what grace means for United Methodists. "In accord with biblical and Christian teaching, we believe that we are sinners, constantly in need of divine grace."*

*She describes grace as God's love toward us, his free and undeserved gift.*

*Prevenient grace=grace that comes before us. We are not able to do anything to help ourselves. We cannot move toward God unless he has first moved toward us. God wants us to be in a loving relationship with him.*

*Convicting grace=makes one conscious of his/her sin and urges him/her to repent.*

*Justifying grace=forgives our mistakes and puts us into a right relationship with God.*

*Sanctifying grace=enables us to grow in holiness of life, it is one's personal journey.*

*Perfecting grace=molds us into the image of Christ.*

*"The grace of God is made available to us through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ and works in our lives through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit."*

*In Methodist practice there are outward signs of these means of grace. Founder John Wesley listed these means of grace in the General Rules, as "'the public worship of God. The ministry of the Word either read or expounded. The Supper of the Lord. Family and private prayer. Searching the Scriptures. Fasting or abstinence.'"*

*These means are ways to receive, live in, and grow in divine grace, not as a way for earning salvation. Mysterion is the Greek word used for sacrament and usually translates to mystery. God discloses things that are beyond human capacity to know through reason alone via sacraments.*

*"Holy Baptism and Holy Communion have been chosen and designated by God as special means through which divine grace comes to us." "Holy Communion is the sacrament that sustains and nourishes us in our journey of salvation."*

*God uses tangible, material things as vehicles or instruments of grace. They make God's love both visible and effective. "Show and Tell" from God that communicates that in our brokenness we can still receive the love of God and experience God's grace.*

*Meaning of Holy Communion: an act of thanksgiving. "It conveys the gratitude for the goodness of God and God's unconditional love for us."*

*Holy Communion may be very meaningful to individuals, but it is much more than a personal event. It is the communion of the church. It is the sharing and bonding experienced during this sacrament that make up the nature of the church and model the world as God wants it.*

*We celebrate the current life of Christ. We do not take communion just to remember the death of Christ, but that Christ is risen and is alive here and now.*

*Communion is also a type of sacrifice. "We present ourselves as sacrifice in union with Christ (Romans 12:1, 1 Peter 2:5) to be used by God in the work of redemption, reconciliation, and justice."*

*God's grace comes to us through the Holy Spirit. We call upon the Holy Spirit during the prayer of the Great Thanksgiving, "Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine." We are asking God to make these elements be for us the body and blood of Christ so that we can be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.*

*Spiritual benefits: forgiveness, nourishment, healing, transformation, ministry and mission, eternal life.*

*"As we return to the table again and again, we are strengthened repeatedly. We go out empowered to live as disciples, reconcilers, and witnesses." As we are shaped into Christ's image, it is a lifelong process through which God intends to mold us into people motivated by love, empowered and impassioned to do Christ's work in the world.*

### **"Love Wins: A Book About Heaven, Hell, and the Fate of Every Person Who Ever Lived"**

By Rob Bell

I just finished reading this recent book by Rob Bell. He is a pastor in Grand Rapids of a very large church. This book has generated a ton of controversy. Some suggesting he has committed heresy others embracing the questions he has raised. Just google the title and read some of the reviews. Even better, go to Amazon and read the almost 400 reviews of Bell's book. I found the book intriguing because it raised so many questions, made me think, and get a new perspective.

Here is an excerpt from one reader:

*I am not a student of the Bible, or a person with a deep understanding of theology. I've never heard of this book until it was mentioned in a column in USA Today. Like millions of others, I'm a lapsed Catholic struggling with all of the questions that Rob Bell puts forth in the beginning of this book. While I search for answers that make sense, and look for a faith where I can belong and be strong, and not be lost and afraid, almost every page of this book spoke to me. I found it a compelling read, eye-opening and heart-opening. Yes, a little "over written" in the dramatic, one-sentence paragraph style. But it worked. When I finished this book, for the first time in decades, I wanted to pray. For the first time in years, I wanted to open a Bible and give it a chance. For the first time in a long time, I went to church because I felt there might be a good reason to go. So the debate can rage among the hard-cores, but I suspect this book can touch millions of hearts like it touched mine. For that reason, I will be recommending it to many friends who struggle with the same question.*

Again, the book has generated controversy. But you know ..... Jesus can handle controversy. Reading and thinking about the concepts and questions put forward in this book will make you think, perhaps inspire you, maybe resolve some questions for you. To me those are signs of a good book. I think it would be great if several of us read this one and had some in depth discussions about it.

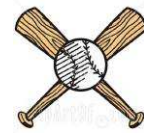
