## Pastor's Ponderings...

**Lay Speaking Class Scheduled**

Lay Speakers are active, supportive members of the United Methodist church who are eager to serve their church in a variety of capacities. Local Lay Speakers serve their local churches while Certified Lay Speakers serve in their own churches, in other churches and through district or conference projects and programs. (A Lay Speaker is not required to preach!) Basic and Advanced classes are offered several times each year in Utah. These classes equip Christians to become better leaders. Each course is 10 hours and is held on a Friday and Saturday. Due to popular demand, the "Lay Speakers Lead Bible Study" will be offered again on June 19-20, 2009. The class is open to Local and Certified Lay Speakers and non-lay speakers who are interested. The cost of the course is \$15 + the cost of the books. Lunch will be provided on Saturday. Persons wishing to take the course must order the books prior to the class. Please e-mail Cheryl at [layspeakers@comcast.net](mailto:layspeakers@comcast.net) to reserve a place in the class and to get information on how order the class books. PLEASE NOTE!!! All Lay Speakers must take a lay speaking course at least once every three years in order to maintain their standing as a Lay Speaker. Lay Speakers who have not taken a class since 2006 must take a class this year.

## News from the Trustees

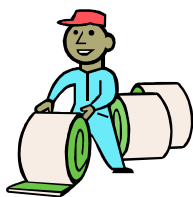

## Mission/Outreach Committee News

There are a few things coming up that the Mission/Outreach Committee would like you to know about. First, there is now an UMCOR depot in Salt Lake City. The depot will be a distribution center for relief supplies to go all over the Western U.S. and other parts of the world. Brian Diggs of First UMC downtown has been named the new director. There will be only two paid positions at first, and they will be relying a lot on volunteer labor. Be on the lookout for organized dates when we will get groups together to go down and assemble relief supplies. The depot is located at 1479 South 700 West. They are planning a grand opening celebration on May 30th, to make the community aware of their presence. We are having a meeting of several church mission committees on May 9th to finalize plans for the opening. After that, we'll get the details out to you.

The Community Food Co-op of Utah is a ministry of Crossroads Urban Center. Through the Co-op, people can get a package of grocery items, including a chicken, ground beef, bread, rice, fruits and vegetables, worth roughly \$40 for \$23. Anyone can order through the co-op; there are no income limitations. All they ask is that you volunteer two hours a month, and it can be anywhere in the community. Most of us already do that. Where we as a church come in, is that they are looking for another distribution point in West Jordan. Currently, the Senior Center by the Gene Fullmer Rec Center is the only outlet, and they provide about 300 orders each month. There is one designated distribution day each month, on a Saturday, and it's only for about an hour. If we were to become a second distribution point, it would bring a lot of new people to our church property that would not otherwise come here. If you have any input as to whether this is a good idea, please direct it to me at 282-1268.

We're again thinking of having an entry in the West Jordan July 4th Parade. If you have any ideas for a float or a display, let me know.

Finally, thanks to all who volunteered their time last month for Family Promise. Watch for our next week to serve, coming up in June.

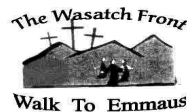

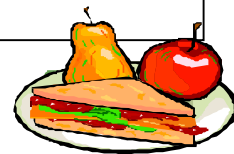
