Worship Planning Team Update

I just wanted to share a little bit about what we are working on this year in this group. We are reviewing the book [This Holy Mystery: A United Methodist Understanding of Holy Communion](#). The author is Gayle Carlton Felton. This book was approved by the 2004 General Conference as "the official, comprehensive statement of the practice and theology of the Lord's Supper" (Felton, pg 6).

The writer wanted the book to be characterized to avoid rigidity on one hand and indifference on the other. "We seek to strengthen the bond of unity by 'speaking the truth in love' (Ephesians 4:15) as, with humility and openness, we acknowledge our principles, explain our backgrounds, and affirm our practices." (Felton, pg. 9)

Various Names of the Sacrament: The Lord's Supper, Last Supper, Holy Communion, Eucharist, Mass, The Divine Liturgy. All these names refer to the same practice: eating and drinking of consecrated bread, juice, wine in the worshipping community. (Felton, pg 9, 10)

Early Methodism: John Wesley and his brother, Charles, (who were from England) recognized the power of God available in the Lord's Supper and urged their followers to draw on that power by frequent participation. "They wrote about love, grace, sacrifice, forgiveness, the presence of Christ, mystery, healing, nourishment, holiness, and pledge of heaven." (Felton, pg. 11) Our current understanding of sacrament follows their lead. They knew that communion was a way to experience God's grace.

Early American Methodists who began arriving in the 1760's were at first able to receive communion from the Anglican churches of which they were considered a part, but then the Methodists began to reject the English church, and most Anglican priests left the country. By the mid 1770's the Methodists had no access to the sacraments because they had no one able to bless the sacraments. Missionary preachers (laymen) were sent by Wesley, but they still had no authority to baptize or do communion. In 1784 the Methodist Episcopal Church was created and some preachers were ordained, but still not enough to serve all the Methodists! Most Methodists were able to receive communion quarterly during the decades of the circuit riders. The habit of quarterly Holy Communion remained strong even through the 19 and 20th century! (Felton, pg 12)

During the 19th and 20th centuries the tone of the sacrament became a more solemn event. It called upon people to repent and was deeply penitential. They placed less emphasis on the celebration of God's grace. Wesleyan understandings of Eucharist were largely lost and communion had taken the form of remembering the death of Christ. Communion Sunday attendance decreased in many of these churches. (Felton, pg 12).

It is our understanding that there is not a set time to have communion. It could vary, depending on if you have someone with the authority to bless the sacraments from quarterly to daily. This is an act for you to have a meaningful time with God, it is personal! You may prefer to do that once a month or several times a week, it is up to you.

It is our hope that you take what you need from these sacraments. If you need to repent, do so! If you want to remember the death of Christ and what he means in your life, do so! If you want to experience Christ's love, grace, healing, forgiveness, please do so!

This material was taken from Part One: There is More to the Mystery. I will provide you with more information as we continue to review the book.

Book review:

The Epic of Eden: A Christian Entry into the Old Testament

By Sandra L. Richter Published by Inter-Varsity Press, 2008
What a delightful read!! The book given to me by dear friends
Debi and Kurt Paulsen is really a great find. Any studies that I
run in the future that include the Old Testament will have this
as a companion text. The premise of the book is that the
knowledge most of us we have of the Old Testament is like a
grab bag of people, books, events and ideas with little
understanding of the underlying theme .. that is that it is a
story of redemption. The suggests that our knowledge and
understanding of the Old Testament is sort of like a
disorganized closet of clothing. The author uses the covenants
of Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses, David, Jesus as sort of
hanging separators in the closet to organize things. Then other
stuff is organized around that sort of like hangers. Discussion
of what is meant by covenant, dynamics of Israelite home life,
geography, really helps to understand so much of what goes
on in the Old Testament.

The whole closet ... is put in usable order ... a history of
God's redeeming grace. A story that runs from Eden of the
Garden to the garden of the New Jerusalem. This is a book
that can renew your enthusiasm for studying the Bible. I
highly recommend it.

UMCOR Disaster Response

RELIEF...The first phase of UMCOR response is relief. It takes the form of shipment and distribution of material goods (water purification tablets, blankets, tents, food, medical supplies and clothing) wherever and whenever needed, within the shortest time possible after the disaster. It also involves aiding transportation, and offering a sympathetic ear and general counsel wherever it is sought. When possible, UMCOR works in cooperation with other voluntary agencies in response to human need in the disaster situation.

CLEAN-UP...Some of UMCOR's most effective service is in helping storm and flood victims clean-up. The work is difficult yet it offers opportunity for unskilled workers to help and to develop a missional relationship with victims. Usually premises can be cleaned and personal possessions salvaged without detailed inspection by insurance adjusters.

REBUILDING...Reconstruction is more complicated and begins after the emergency period is over. This phase of the rehabilitation program involves securing materials and special skills and requires insurance adjusters to be involved. It is not part of the emergency operation.

PASTORAL COUNSELING...The most important task of the church in a disaster is to give counsel to those who have suffered loss, both human and material. Its' role is to be a supportive and encouraging presence during the period when other agencies are at work in the disaster area and when they have disengaged.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH AFFECTED BY DISASTER...A program has been established that is geared for children and youth through the local church to enable them to overcome the trauma caused by the loss of their home and belongings when a disaster strikes.

As United Methodist, we stay until the work is done.
