### **Pastor's Ponderings** "From a Grateful Pastor"

After attending worship at our church, a first-time guest emailed me the next week with a question: "I was wondering what makes a Methodist church different than other churches?"

My response was as follows:

Two things that are very distinctive about the United Methodist Church are its inclusivity and its broad scope for discerning God's will.

Our denominational motto is "Open Hearts, Open Doors, Open Minds." We have open communion for anyone who desires to take part—no matter their religion, age, sexual orientation, or anything else because we believe it is God's Table, not a United Methodist table, and God's love is the same for all people.

When it comes to discerning God's will for us, United Methodists look to a variety of God's gifts for us: Reason, Experience, Scripture (primary), and Tradition. (I like to use the acronym, "REST.") We believe God did not quit speaking to us when the Bible was finished, but continues to reach us through a myriad of different avenues, including those above.

So, in this season of Thanksgiving, one of the many things I am thankful for is being part of a denomination whose arms are wide open, as we believe God to be. Even more so, I am thankful to be a part of a local church that actually lives out our motto.

I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that God who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. —

## ***What Are You Thankful For?***

*1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (NIV):*

<sup>16</sup> *Rejoice always,* <sup>17</sup> *pray continually,* <sup>18</sup> *give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.*

Soon we will once again celebrate Thanksgiving. It is perhaps the one day each year when collectively, as a society, we pause to ponder all that we have to be grateful for. We realize that in spite of any difficulties or problems we may be experiencing, we can still find something for which we are grateful. That may be our family, dear friends, good health, material blessings, or a beloved pet. But the Bible tells us that God wants us to be thankful always, in all circumstances.

When we experience difficulties or tragedies in our lives, it is hard to focus on anything else. We have a tendency to lose sight of positive things in our lives and become mired in the challenges; we may become despondent . . . even bitter. Yet when Thanksgiving rolls around, we tend to rally and find that one shining light in our darkness. Soon we realize that we actually still have much to embrace in our lives and we have a shift in focus; a ray of optimism and hope. Life isn't all bad.

In 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, we are not only encouraged to give thanks in all circumstances but to rejoice always. And we are told that this is the will of God for each of us. It would seem that God wants us to be optimistic. To remember that "weeping may remain for a night, but rejoicing comes in the morning." (Psalm 30:5)

It is said that optimistic people live longer and healthier lives. Life experience teaches us what Jesus taught us . . . in this world we will have trouble. But we also know that troubles pass; and Jesus reminds us to take heart because he has overcome the world. Through our faith in Christ, we too can overcome the world. When we are most troubled, most in despair, in the depths of grief, or in the grips of illness, we should pause to count our blessings. We should pray for courage and strength. We should share our burdens with others who love us. And we should give thanks . . . not for the circumstances but in spite of them. And who knows? Perhaps when our troubles pass, we will be able to see something good that arose out of our trials and even give thanks *for* the circumstances.

Perhaps this Thanksgiving will find you without cares and worries. But if not, what will you be thankful for? I'll bet you'll discover that regardless of your hardships, you'll be able to make a rather lengthy list of what is good and right in your life. And in so doing, your spirits will be lifted and your burdens easier to bear.

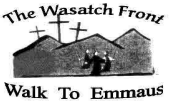

**UMCOR West: a ministry of hope here in Utah and around the world**

On Sept 16<sup>th</sup>, at UMCOR West in Salt Lake City, a hard working and dedicated group of volunteers prayerfully packed a 40 foot shipping container with 15,792 school kits which were sent to children and families in Haiti. As expected, Haiti is still in the infancy of a long and slow recovery from the devastating earthquake of 2010, and UMCOR will be there for years to come. The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is the humanitarian branch of the United Methodist Church. For more information please visit UMCOR.org.

For two years now, UMCOR West Office and Depot has been an integral part of UMCOR's overall mission in places like Haiti. On a weekly basis, volunteers have been traveling to UMCOR West to put together disaster relief kits which are then sent to the most vulnerable of populations around the world. Since opening our doors on May 31<sup>st</sup> of 2009, UMCOR West has been in "full swing" providing a fun and life-giving mission opportunity for United Methodists in the Western Jurisdiction as well as from across the nation.

Crucial to the continued success of UMCOR West is the support of all of our local churches here in Utah and in the rest of the Rocky Mountain Conference. Since we opened, the churches in the valley have made a huge mark on UMCOR West's growth; local churches have sent numerous volunteers, donated supplies, and have kept the ministry in their prayers, and now we ask for your continued support.

Currently we are in need of supplies to build our kits as we approach the end of 2011. Our focus kits for the rest of the year are school kits, layette kits, and clean birthing kits. The contents of these kits can be found at UMCOR.org. Please consider helping restock our depot for future groups.

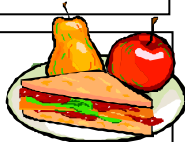
