## Pastor's Ponderings... "Fiery Sermon"

It was a cold evening when the pastor paid a visit to one of the people in the congregation who had not been to church for a long time. The man looked a little surprised and maybe a little embarrassed when he greeted the pastor at the front door, but he invited him in with a warm smile. It was warm in the home, as well. There was a fire burning in the fireplace. The man offered the pastor a seat by the fire and a cup of hot tea. The pastor accepted both gladly.

The two sat together silently in front of the fire, enjoying the tea and the warmth and glow of the fire. Staring into the flames had sort of a hypnotizing, calming effect on the two. After a long stretch of quiet warmth, the pastor got out of his chair and, without a word, picked up the metal tongs next to the fire. With the tongs, he picked up a small piece of wood that was burning brightly on top of the fire. He laid it carefully on the stone hearth, then sat back down. He and his host watched as the flame on the little piece of wood went out. There was still a glow, but the glow slowly dimmed until the wood went black, and a tiny wisp of smoke curled into the air, like a last gasp for breath. The pastor looked at the man. The man looked back at the pastor. The pastor stood up from his chair once again, walked to the fireplace, picked up the charred piece of wood with the tongs, and laid it back on top of the blazing stack of wood. In just seconds, the little piece of wood caught fire again, and the warm, reddish-orange glow returned.

As the man bid the pastor farewell at the front door, he said with a grin, "Thanks for the fiery sermon, Pastor! I'll see you Sunday!" The pastor walked back out into the cold evening, but felt warm as toast, inside and out.

Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching (Hebrews 10:23-25).

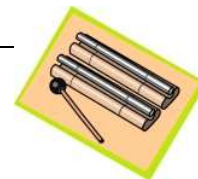
