## Pastor's Ponderings... "Prayer Concerns"

I have been thinking a lot **about things concerning prayer** lately. Since the beginning of the year, I have been going into the church sanctuary from 8 to 8:15 a.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays for prayer time. I have been inviting people of our church to pray with me during that time, whether at the church or wherever you may be. Since I began this prayer time, there have been a half dozen who have joined me here at the church—two, in particular, on a very regular basis.

The Great Commandment ("The Prime Directive" as I like to call it, being a Trekkie and all) is Jesus' command to us that summarizes all that God desires for us in God's Word: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength" (Mark 12:30). Because God wants me to love God with all the gifts God has given me to give back to God, I have been considering how I can give balance to my prayer life by praying with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength.

I have more of an emotive approach to life than a rational approach. (I hope this does not make me *irrational*, but there are times...) I often lead with my heart over my head. So, I have been praying God will teach me to balance my gifts of sensitivity with gifts of reasoning. I also am asking God to make me more aware of my eternal spirit and that of others so my prayers are not only about the temporal things of the heart and head, but prayer of the heart, mind, and soul.

Finally, how do I pray with all my strength? I am learning the process is much along the same lines as the words of John 1:14: "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us." God leads me to put hands and feet on my prayers. God leads me to BE the answer to some of the prayers I pray. Words, thoughts and attitudes become action. I pray, "Dear God, please help Jim in his loneliness." Then I go visit Jim.

These are some of my thoughts concerning prayer—my prayer concerns. As we pray for one another, would you pray for my prayer life? I will pray for yours. May we always be a church about which it can be said, "This Church is Prayer-Conditioned."

One of my favorite authors is Roland Merullo - two offerings from him:

Take a road trip trippin' with **Breakfast with Buddha**. It involves six days on the road with publisher Otto Ringling and a holy man who answers every question with a riddle. Otto decides to show the monk some American fun along the way at a Hershey chocolate factory tour, bowling alley in Ohio, taqueria, and of course, at diner breakfasts. Otto find himself experiencing yoga, Himalayan food, and a whole new way of looking at at his own life. Merullo's gift is slipping gentle spiritual lessons into plot and place, giving your mind fodder for months to come.

**American Savior**, also by Merullo is a what if book; what if Jesus showed up today. . .and ran for President. It's entirely readable, thought provoking, and made me a little sad that it wasn't a non-fiction work. This writer has an imagination and sense of humor that makes his writing tastier than any pastry, yet satisfying like meat and potatoes. You'll be thinking about the book long after you close the last page.

### Operation Christmas Child

Dear Mt. Vista family and friends,

I am writing to invite you to join me in sharing the love of Jesus with "all the children in the world." Your mission for this week (should you choose to accept it) is to first to pray.

Pray for the children in other countries that will benefit not only by receiving physical items (toys, school supplies, toiletries) that they may not currently have, but also the spiritual gifts through hearing the gospel.

Pray about how many children you may wish to sponsor this holiday season.

Pray about what those children may need. There are endless stories about children receiving "the box" containing "the item" that they had wished for. While you are out running errands this week, you may want to pick up a couple of extra toothbrushes, bars of soap, wash cloths, pencils, crayons, colored pencils, tubes of toothpaste, socks, underwear, flashlights, notebooks, batteries, small toys, etc.

Other ways that you may help to support Operation Christmas Child (OCC) are the following:

- Bring empty shoe boxes to the church for others to fill. Feel free to wrap the shoe boxes in Christmas wrapping paper, making sure to wrap the top and bottom of the box separately.
- Have a lemonade stand to raise money to support OCC. (These funds can go to pay for shipping boxes for people that can donate supplies but can not afford the shipping costs.)
- Involve others within your community to participate in OCC. I can help you get door hangers and brochures to share with neighbors/friends.

I will be available each Sunday at Mt. Vista UMC (October 3rd - November 15th) to give you empty shoe boxes and brochures and to answer any questions you may have. This year you are able to pay for the shipping of your box online through EZ Give at [https://www.samaritanspurse.org/index.php/OCC/EZ\\_Give\\_Donations/](https://www.samaritanspurse.org/index.php/OCC/EZ_Give_Donations/) This allows you to follow which country your box is sent to and information about OCC in that country.

#### School supplies:

Pencils, Small notebooks, Markers, Pencil type crayons (real crayons will melt), Plastic bracelets, Stickers with Christian icons, Small plastic magnifying glasses, Pencil sharpeners  
Coloring books.

#### Clothing:

Underwear, Children's & Men's white socks, flip flops, all sizes, Clean sheets any size, Slightly used cloth diapers and covers. Disposable paper surgical drapes, ask your local hospital of medical staff friends.

#### Toiletries:

Toothbrushes, Toothpaste, Bar soap, Laundry soap, Sanitary pads, Prenatal vitamins.

Pepto-Bismol tabs diarrhea, OTC Imodium-diarrhea, OTC Cipro for diarrhea, Zantac, Rehydration salts, Antacids and acid reflux meds (Tums, Prilosec or Nexium). Multi-vitamins-children's chewable, adult and women's. Pain and fever meds (adult & child). Anti-fungal & anti-itch creams (hydrocortisone cream, calamine lotion). Cough medicines (for both dry and wet/mucus coughs).

### Excerpts from “Volunteer Teams Aid in Haiti Recovery”

The Methodist Guest House in Port-au-Prince is still sheltering those afraid to return to their homes—the large outdoor basketball court is filled with tents. But it also has become a staging ground for volunteer teams being dispersed to different parts of Haiti.

United Methodist congregations have been sending work teams to Haiti for more than two decades. What makes the earthquake recovery project unusual, said Gregory Forrester, mission coordinator for the denomination's Northeastern Jurisdiction, is that teams will be rotated through project sites designated by the Methodist Church of Haiti and many Haitians are being hired to support the work teams.

When Forrester, who has visited Haiti annually over the past 15 years, and two other jurisdictional coordinators returned in February, they found that supplies were available, “but no one could buy them.”




To address the lack of a functioning economy in Haiti, the proposal for volunteer teams—adopted by UMCOR directors in April—recommended, at minimum, a two-to-one ratio of hired Haitians to team members for a work site.

“We bought all our food local,” he said. “We hired for laundry. We had people providing security for us. We actually fed all the laborers who were on the job site with us and hired cooks as well.”

Clearing rubble is one of the current tasks for volunteer teams, said Melissa Crutchfield, the UMCOR executive in charge of international disasters. Temporary structures are being built for churches and schools. “Right now, the only thing you can use is a tent or temporary structure, which should last a couple of years. They are pretty solid structures,” she explained. “But the government is trying to be very deliberate about building codes moving forward. They don't want permanent structures built until they can develop earthquake proof, hurricane proof, top-of-line engineering feats.”

“If we all join together to lift one block of fallen concrete or cut one piece of twisted rebar, then yes, in time, it will get done. We must not give up. New structures will rise from rubble.” Sandy Binotto, a member of First Romney (W. Va.) United Methodist Church.
