Pastor's Ponderings... "The Perfect Prayer"

During the late 1950's and early 1960's, Bobby Richardson played second base for the New York Yankees. Richardson was nominated nine times for Most Valuable Player of the American League. He played in seven All-star Games. He won five Gold Glove Awards. Richardson was also the only man in baseball history to ever win the World Series Most Valuable Player Award playing for the losing team. In the later years of Bobby Richardson's career, he coached the baseball team at the Christian school, Liberty University. The reason such a great player was willing to coach at a Christian university was because he was a committed follower of Jesus Christ. During a speech at a meeting of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Bobby Richardson was asked to pray. Here is the prayer:

"Dear God, Your will, nothing more, nothing less, nothing else. Amen."

When I first heard of this prayer, my son, Scott, was playing basketball in his senior year of high school. He had asked the coach if he could say a prayer before each game with the team. The coach agreed, but Scott was having trouble coming up with just the right words. I told him about this prayer, and it became the locker room prayer before every game. I was very proud when, at the basketball awards ceremony after the season, the coach honored Scott as the "Team Chaplain."

This prayer is perfect at the beginning of each game. This prayer is perfect at the beginning of each day. Even Jesus prayed to God, "Not my will, but yours be done" (Luke 22:42). When we pray this prayer, our prayer is ALWAYS answered, "YES!"

Ask, Seek, Knock
Or
Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors

Life throws us curves. Or, according to an old Yiddish proverb, man plans, God laughs. It doesn't mean that God is the one that throws us the curve. And it doesn't mean God *isn't* the one throwing the curve. I don't think that's something we can know with a certainty and we probably shouldn't waste our time trying to figure it out. The fact is, unexpected things happen to us in our lives; but God is with us in the expected and in the unexpected.

Those who are optimistic (or executives at large corporations) will sometimes refer to adverse circumstances as "opportunities." Recently, I was given a wonderful opportunity for new employment. Yes . . . on July 14th, I was laid off. But thanks to many good friends, I've been reminded that to be out of work really is an opportunity. First and foremost, it's an opportunity to be vulnerable. It's an opportunity to need others, to rely on others, to allow others the opportunity to minister and serve and to be humbled – not by being "brought down" but humbled by the love and goodness of others. It's an opportunity to reflect and ponder . . . to ask, seek, and knock. To open my heart and my mind to walking through a new door. It's said that when God closes a door, somewhere He opens a window . . . or another door as the case may be.

I felt blindsided by my lay off. Talk about unexpected and not in the plans! I can't explain all of the emotions I felt at the time because I was feeling so many things all at once it seemed. Anger, worry, determination, and sorrow. I loved my job. I loved my co-workers; the clients I worked with; and what my company was doing for people. I truly felt bereft – almost like being in mourning. Truth be told, I still feel that way to a degree. And I felt the need to protect Geniel from this devastating news. I didn't want to burden her. And yet, she was the person I needed most and the person who most needed to know. Her reaction was one of calm, resolve and reassurance; I needn't have worried about telling her. Geniel is a "doer." When there is a problem, she looks for a way to fix it. As a registered nurse, she felt pretty confident that she could secure full-time employment with benefits fairly quickly and she did; within a week! What a blessing!

After telling Geniel the news, the very first thing I did was post it on my facebook page and my LinkedIn page . . . "I've been laid off, I'm in the job market." In other words, "help!" I did this because I know that God put us here together as family and friends to help each other. Because I believe that we are truly the hands and feet of Jesus in this world and that we are called to be such. And because I am blessed to know so many people who believe the same thing. Nevertheless, I have been overwhelmed by the support I have received. Including assistance from people I barely know or who are complete strangers to me.

Virtually everyone I know tells me they are praying for me and as all of us know, that means so much. It isn't trite and sometimes, that's all we can do. But what more meaningful way is there to tell someone you love them than by praying for them? I've been praying too and although I may not have a new job yet, my prayers are being answered. Not in the way I had expected . . . but in an unexpected way.

Shortly after I was laid off, I got into a discussion about prayer with Cindie Selbo. Actually, it was somewhat of a debate! I expressed my concern about Christians talking about answered and unanswered prayer. I felt it gave people the wrong impression – that God ignores some prayers. I stated that I believed God answers all prayers and sometimes the answer is, "no" and that we need to recognize and accept that; and have faith that God has a reason and a purpose for the, "no." Yet we as Christians often talk about "answered" prayers only when what we prayed for is what we got. My fear was that God could appear rather arbitrary; like a genie granting a wish.

Cindie said that she believes God always finds a way to say, "yes" but the "yes" isn't always said in the way we expect. I struggled with that. I think I disagreed with her at the time but the idea stuck and I've been pondering it for weeks, especially in light of my current circumstances. I've come to the conclusion that Cindie is right.

In Matthew 7:7-12, Jesus tells us to ask, seek and knock. All who ask receive; all who seek find; and the door is opened to all who knock. The Greek word Jesus used for "ask" means we should ask for what we want constantly and persistently. He said it would be given to us because everyone who asks receives. That tells us that God does indeed always say yes. But there's more to it than that . . .

In Matthew 6:19-21, Jesus says, “¹⁹Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. ²⁰But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”

And then in Matthew 6:33, Jesus says, “But seek first [God’s] kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.”

When we ask, the first thing we must do is open our hearts. We must acknowledge to ourselves we have a need – either for ourselves or someone else – and we must acknowledge that God can meet that need. In opening our hearts to God, we also are acknowledging that an open heart is a two-way street. We recognize that God loves us and that we love God. And if we love him, then we will take the next step which is . . .

. . . To open our minds to seek God’s will. We cannot know the mind of God, but we can understand that our desires must serve a heavenly purpose. We must seek God’s kingdom and righteousness. An open mind is also a two-way street and a mind opened in prayer is communicating to God a need and listening for God’s response. An open mind will understand that the response may come in an unexpected way . . . after all; doesn’t the Lord work in mysterious ways?

So now when I consider “unanswered” prayers, I have a better understanding that God most certainly isn’t saying, “no” and he most certainly is responding – just not in the way I had in mind. As the Apostle Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 13:12, “For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.”

So first, we open our hearts and ask; then we open our minds and seek. Finally, we knock or we hear the knock and the door is opened. When we open our hearts and minds, we open new doors for ourselves to walk through or for others to enter our lives. I have knocked on many doors over the past two months. So far, none has been opened by a prospective employer, but many others have been opened to me.

This experience has indeed been an opportunity for me to learn and grow . . . as a husband, as a father, as a friend; and yes, even as an employee. Most importantly, I think I have grown in my faith.

Cindie and Jerry recently returned from a trip to New Mexico where they believe they found an opportunity for a mission for members of our church to serve. For us to go *out* our door and into the world with open hearts and open minds; where we might open the hearts and minds of others and perhaps open new doors for them, as well. But they and many others of you have already served a mission right here at MVUMC opening new doors for one of your own who is asking and seeking.

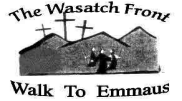

## 2012 Mission Opportunity

Cindie and I recently visited her mom's cousin in New Mexico. We send Christmas cards back and forth each year, but I had never met her, and Cindie had not seen her since she was a teenager. Her name is Pat, and she has spent the last fifteen years or so working with the Navajo people near the little town of Cuba, New Mexico. The Navajo nation mainly extends through Arizona and New Mexico. It is broken, geographically, into areas called chapters. The chapter that Pat mainly serves is called Torreon/Star Lake. It numbers about 4,000 people, who are geographically disbursed. The unemployment rate in the chapter is about 40 percent, and the percentage of families below the poverty line is about 55 percent.

Part of our reason for visiting was to scope out potential mission opportunities, and there seems to be plenty. We'd like to get a group together to go down next summer and do some projects. Things we might be looking at could include building raised beds for a community garden, finish work for a new senior center, roofing repairs for senior citizens, and erosion control projects. The work would be pretty physical. The topography is high desert, around 6800 feet. We'd like to open it up to youth and adults: anyone who wants to go.

We'll get more information as time goes on. Once we get an idea who might be going, we can pick some potential dates and start planning. I'm envisioning a 7 or 8 day trip; with two travel days, four work days, and one or two sightseeing days in Santa Fe or Albuquerque.
